

## 2009 Summer School Info

Summer school classes are on a “first come, first served” basis and tend to fill up fast.

### High School

In order to advance from grade 9 to grade 10 a student must have earned a minimum of five (5) credits. A minimum of eleven (11) credits is required to reach grade 11 and at least seventeen (17) credits must be earned for a student to be assigned to grade 12.



Any high school student who failed any of the first semester class(es), or is about to fail any second semester class(es) should register now with Washoe County School District Summer School. ### Middle School

Per CAS grade promotion policy, every middle school student is required to pass all core courses to be promoted to the next grade level. Core classes are Math, English, Social Studies and Science.

## UNIFORM CODE & SUMMER SCHOOL POLICIES

Parents: The CAS student handbook will be followed. You will be asked to sign a statement that you have read and understand the expectations for dress, behavior, and attendance.

### **Registration Deadline**

Registration closes on May 22, 2009. Please register with Mrs. Quinn prior to May 22<sup>nd</sup>.

### **Summer School Fees**

The fee is \$100 per each summer school class. Fees are due by May 22, 2009.

**Refunds:** There is a \$25 processing fee assessed for any refund given, the only exception is when classes are canceled by CAS. No refunds will be given after the second day of class.

**Attendance:** Attendance and punctuality are critical for successful completion of any course taken in summer school. If a student misses one **unexcused** absence or more than one **excused** absence, s/he is withdrawn from the class and no grade is issued. The excused absence is built into the program for emergency use—illness, family emergency, etc. and are not to be used unless there is a legitimate reason. Vacations, tournaments, state or national competitions, conventions, conferences and appointments are examples of absences that are **not** accepted and therefore, unexcused.

**Punctuality:** Since tardiness is disruptive as well as disrespectful to the teacher and other students, it will not be tolerated in summer school classes. A student will be warned at his/her first tardy (any fraction of a minute after the scheduled start time of class). The teacher will document on the attendance card that the student has been warned and will notify parents. **If a student is tardy three times the student will be withdrawn from the class and will not receive credit for the course.**
